Stressing that peace is ensured between the People's Republic of China (PRC) and Taiwan,

Recognizes rules set out by the "One China Policy" and the UN General Assembly Resolution 2758,

Reminding that NATO's main purpose is for the security of the member countries,

Recognizing the tense conflict between the PRC (People's Republic of China) and Taiwan on whether or not Taiwan should be considered an independent country, a sovereign country, or is a part of China,

Deeply concerns the members of NATO that, if a war was to be provoked between China and Taiwan, would disrupt world peace,

Aware of ties between NATO countries and China,

Fully aware of consequences if the situation at hand escalates,

Aware that any mishandling of the situation by NATO may result in an escalation,

Expecting to find a solution that doesn't involve military intervention,

- a. Requires NATO to not invoke any military action outside the North Atlantic as this is a direct breach of Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty;
- b. Accepts that military action is not NATO's responsibility;
- c. Urges NATO countries to not involve themselves militarily in the conflict:

Understands that any action taken independently by any NATO country is not the responsibility of NATO,

a.

Calls for NATO to mediate conversation and negotiation between the two parties,

- a. Countries that have a generally neutral position on the matter should send representatives and diplomats representing NATO;
- b. Discussions and negotiations must be held between the People's Republic of Chinaand Taiwan;

Reminding that NATO's main purpose is for making sure that its members have a collective defence at all times

Having considered that the one-China policy will play a major role

Recognizing the help Taiwan would obtain would be stronger than China's such as the military defense of The United States

Expressing Concern that a war started from this could bring mass destruction to land, population, economy, trade, and much more

Referring to the articles given in NATO and the UN Charter

- 1. <u>Calls upon</u> ARTICLE 34 and ARTICLE 1 by which China should be confronted by a member of NATO along with a representative from Taiwan to convince China into amutual agreement by satisfying most of the demands of both Taiwan and China without causing the existing tensions to escalate;
- 2. <u>Invites</u> The mutual agreement must consist of the following few basic demands and agreements from NATO;
- 3. <u>Agreeing</u> that the mutual agreement must consist of the following few basic demands and agreements from NATO;
 - a. China must not engage in any sort of violence or force to suppress Taiwan's people's freedom after the agreement of the peace treaty proposed by the diplomatic nations including members of NATO has been accepted,
 - b. China can impose its 'one country two systems' policy, but with some alterations to its rights and jurisdictions as requested by Taiwan to an extent;
- 4. <u>Agreeing</u> that China can only position its armed forces within close range from Taiwan after the unification in order to avoid tensions between the other nations in and around the Pacific region;
- 5. <u>Acknowledges</u> that if China fails to keep up its end of the agreement or refuses the agreement and decides to invade Taiwan, any country including NATO members can take action and intervene without NATO's involvement;
- 6. <u>Acknowledges</u> that if a NATO member who decides to act on the issue of their own free will can only defend either side and not attack, and if they do(to research on)
- 7. <u>Stresses</u> that If a NATO member who decides to act on the issue of their own free will attacks China on its territorial lands, NATO will not come to its aid when China retaliates;
- 8. <u>Acknowledges</u> that if the NATO member who had intervened had only used armed forces to defend Taiwan and not attack China, NATO will intervene by providing military assistance and aid to help the nation if China had attacked the country in its territorial lands when the country had not directly attacked Chinese territory;
- 9. <u>Acknowledges</u> that If China puts war on NATO's members NATO could send forces read by Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty:
- 10. Requests for China to bring their forces back from the Indo-Pacific;
- 11. <u>Acknowledges</u> that If denied by China, armed forces will be sent by the countries supporting Taiwan which would be much stronger than them,
 - a. Recommends other countries not from NATO to help with the issue at hand and sent diplomats or military forces to help;

12. Considering the last decision of countries to stop trade/ alliance with China even though this may break through many countries, a war this big could need this for China to stop.
